As the end of the year approaches, we realize that another year of the Boy's & Girl's State programs are coming to an end and a new one is about to begin.

The process is started each year in the late fall by reaching out to the high schools to give us a list of their top students as potential delegates. We also have individual students approach us expressing their interest in attending the programs. We then interview all of the interested students to make our selections for the upcoming class. Then we move forward step by step until the delegates that have attended the current year's class come to our August Post meeting to give presentations on their experience.

Boy's State and Girl's State were begun in the mid 1930's, when two American Legion members from Illinois noticed that the Soviet Union was setting up "Youth Pioneer Camps" around the United States, promoting communism. They determined that if we wanted to keep our democratic republic form of government, young people must get the opportunity to learn how government is supposed to function.

Over the years, they became nationwide programs. Then, Boy's Nation and Girl's Nation were created

This year, about 900 delegates from the 62 New York

counties participated in the New York Boy's & Girl's State programs. Of this total, over 100 or almost 12% of them came from Suffolk County alone. Delegates from Post 1244 accounted for about 17% of the county total. This was our 16<sup>th</sup> year working with the program.

After starting with two delegates each during the first couple of years, we have been able to expand the program, and have now selected a total of about 225 delegates to participate in Boy's & Girl's State. Without the help, support and generosity of our community


leaders and local businesses we would not have been able to send this many delegates over the years.

For the past few years, New York State Assemblyman Steve Stern has been able to get us a \$10k grant which has been very beneficial to the program.

The ceremony, which has been conducted annually for many years by the Greenlawn Post, will be attended by many veterans, government officials and members of the public.

This is the only Veterans Day ceremony in the Town of Huntington to take place on the actual date of Veterans Day.

All members, veterans and the public are invited to participate in this ceremony which is dedicated to honor all Veterans, past and present.



# SailAhead Summer Veterans Sailing

SailAhead's eighth annual event with the Centerport Yacht Club was held with overwhelming participation and deep significance, honoring veterans and providing a healing day on the water. Nearly 40 boats, along with two helicopters, filled Long Island Sound to commemorate the lives and sacrifices of veterans, as well as to promote mental health awareness. Over 140 veterans and their guests attended this year, including 20 homeless veterans, cadets from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA), and a U.S. Marine Corps Color Guard.

A key focus of the event was honoring U.S. Army Ranger SPC Ryan James Day, who tragically died by suicide at 21 years old while stationed in Washington State. His father, Jim Day, gave an emotional speech, paying tribute to his son's life and sharing the impact of mental health challenges on military families. Also remembered was USMC Lance Corporal Michael Blanco, whose memory was honored by the American Legion Riders under the leadership of his father, Bruce Blanco. Like Ryan Day, Michael lost his life to suicide, at the tender age of 18.

Thanks to the partnership and support of organizations like Greenlawn American Legion Post 1244, Northport American Legion Post 694, the Northport VA, and the United War Veterans Council, this event continues to impact, and even save lives, as US Army Ranger Ron O'Ferral admitted it did two years ago. The day's festivities were marked by perfect wind conditions, allowing all boats to sail beautifully, creating an energizing experience for both seasoned and novice sailors alike.

Special recognition was given to the Centerport

Yacht Club and its skippers, whose leadership and generosity made the event possible, as well as to the Northport Yacht Club for their participation and support. It was a collective effort by both clubs, and others, that brought joy and peace to the veterans, many of whom had never been on a boat before.

We extend heartfelt gratitude to everyone involved, especially the American Legion Riders, the skippers, and our incredible veterans. This event reminds us all of the power of community and the importance of coming



together to support those who have served. SailAhead looks forward to continuing this tradition and honoring our heroes in the years to come.

Greetings, fellow Legionnaires. September is an interesting month. Labor Day signifies the end of summer, school is back in session, and we commemorate 9-11 which brings out many different memories and feelings for

people. September is also Suicide awareness month, and September 20 is POW MIA day.

On August 30, three post members, Past Commander Donna Boyle, Legion Rider George Barbaro and myself participated in the **22 PTSD Awareness Challenge**, a suicide awareness kayak trip across Long Island Sound.

Leading into 9-11 there was a Town of Huntington ceremony, and a Town of Oyster Bay ceremony. On September 11, Rolling Thunder member Billy Byrne made a motorcycle journey from Montauk Point at sunrise, to Ground Zero, (the World Trade Center site) to Shanksville PA to the Pentagon and back to Ground Zero in one day. I was proud to ride with a group at 3:30am, to Montauk point to see him off. Then it was back to Huntington to meet with the Post 1244 Riders for an escort of Mary Walker to the Huntington Manor

FD Ceremony. At 8:46 am there was the 343 soundings of the bell in honor of the NYC firefighters who perished on 9-11. Mary is the widow of the late Herb Walker, Legion Rider, who succumbed to illness caused by exposure as he worked at Ground Zero in the days after the attack.

I attended the Town of Babylon ceremony at Cedar Beach at 6 pm with several riders and lastly the 8pm candlelight ceremony at the fire department in my hometown of East Northport. Dog tag's, one for every soldier that died in the war on terrorism are on a display, It is a must see.

On September 20, the Town of Babylon conducts its annual POW / MIA ceremony at Town Hall. Several Riders represented Post 1244 at that event.

There's many other events we participated in. We would like to see some more post members at these events in the future. Looking forward to a great Fall!

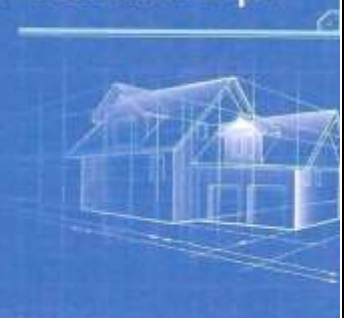
